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LAGCOE to host Education & Innovation Summit October 26-27, 2016 at Cajundome Convention Center

The GEAR UP students will rotate through multiple interactive learning stations including the Mobile Oilfield Learning Unit, MOLU, training simulators and educational resources. MOLU is an engaging traveling exhibit which features learning centers with hands-on activities designed to educate students about energy and the technologies and sciences involved with the oil and gas industry.

The LAGCOE Student Paper Competition allows students from Louisiana universities to showcase their latest research projects to a panel of judges. University research is a key component to developing the next innovations with industry application. Anyone interested in hearing the students present their findings is welcome to attend this session.

V.P. of Drilling for Chesapeake Energy Corporation, David Bert, will address the importance of innovation in the energy industry especially in a down energy economy at the Energy Innovator's Keynote Luncheon. The luncheon will immediately be followed by the highly anticipated Energy Innovators Pitch Challenge, a "shark tank" style competition where five selected companies will pitch an innovative idea or business to potential investors in front of the audience. LAGCOE continues its partnership with INNOV8 Acadiana to propel the next industry innovations by linking ideas and investors.

"Great innovations come out of hard economic times," said Kenny Crouch, owner of Pressure Control Specialties, LLC and current LAGCOE Chairman of the Board. "We are optimistic that some of these sessions will spark great innovation in the energy industry."

DRILLS, created and facilitated by EXCELERANT, will showcase the value of seasoned professionals mentoring the upcoming leaders of the energy industry. The session will engage current leaders of the oil and gas industry in conversation about ensuring a pipeline of prepared, qualified senior and executive oil and gas leaders.

For those interested in entering or re-entering the energy industry, LAGCOE will host the Career Development and Networking Expo, presented by The Daily Advertiser, which will educate attendees about best practices for job searching and other useful career development skills. Sessions will include resume review, interview tips and understanding the job application process from human resource professionals. Pre-registration for this free event is required for admittance.
